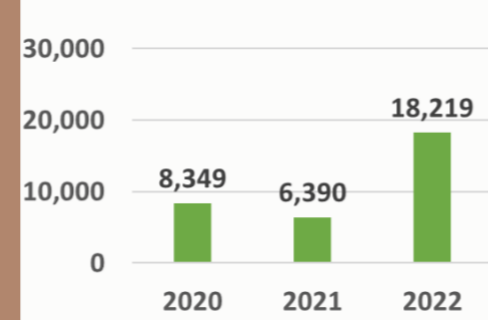

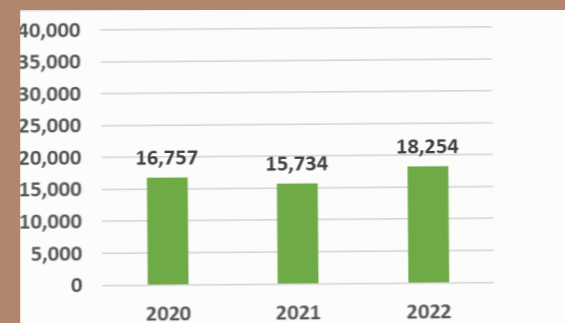
CIRCULATION

2022 HIGHLIGHTS

- Offered as a “first in Canada” the Lata65 program, Street Art Seniors of Stouffville (SASS), through a New Horizons for Seniors federal grant and a Legacy Foundation grant.
- Returned to full in-person programming. The Library offered 636 in-person programs, attended by 18,219 residents, while the Art Centre offered 237 in-person programs, attended by 8,274 residents.
- Completed the Library Facility and Services Master Plan, which received approval from the Library Board and Town Council.
- Partnered with Town Leisure to launch curated exhibitions in the Town Office Gallery space.
- Launched three new collections for our residents: Jigsaw Puzzles, Board Games, and Blu-Ray movies.
- Launched a new digital streaming service, Hoopla, that offers eBooks, eAudiobooks, Digital Comics, Movies, Music, and Television Series.
- Implemented a new catalogue overlay called VEGA Discover, to make searching and discovery simpler and more accessible for our residents.
- Hosted three new large-scale events: Skilled Trades Expo, Fan Fest, and the Human Library.
- Created new adult art education opportunities through programming including Vision Board Workshops, Printmaking Workshops, and in partnership with Town Leisure, Wine & Paint Nights.
- Re-launched the Beyond Craft Show & Sale during the Town’s Holiday Market.
- Re-instated our quarterly print program guide, which won a Gold Hermes Creative Award.
- Partnered with 15 local area schools to create and host the 2022 Celebrations exhibition of student artwork.
